The district's 61 square miles encompass the city of Dickinson and the unincorporated communities of Bacliff and San Leon and a portion of League City and Texas City.

The mission of the Dickinson Independent School District is to ensure that all students have successful learning opportunities that help them reach their full potential and add quality throughout their lives.



The District's enrollment is approximately 6500 students. The ethnic distribution in the District is 46% white, 37% Hispanic, 12% African-American, and 4% other. Economically disadvantaged students are 53.8% of the total enrollment. Approximately 12% of students have limited proficiency in the English language. Approximately 83% of seniors plan to pursue higher education. The graduation rate is 88%.

In Dickinson ISD, we take pride in the caliber of teachers who make their careers here. Teachers and support staff are encouraged to further their skills and knowledge through advanced degrees and professional workshops, seminars and conferences. The District staff numbers more than 800, including teachers, support staff such as counselors, nurses, librarians and diagnosticians, paraprofessional staff, bus drivers, maintenance and food service.

### Extracurricular Activities and Community Involvement

DISD schools offer numerous extracurricular activities including drama and musical productions, choir and band, service organizations and clubs. The middle school, junior high and high school compete in academic contests including Academic Decathlon, UIL Academic Competition, and competitive sports governed by the University Interscholastic League (UIL). A comprehensive athletic program is available to students in grades 7-12. All campuses have active parent organizations that support various school activities. Over 300 local business partners volunteer in CHAMPS (Community Helpers Accelerate Many Promising Students).

### REGISTRATION AND TRANSFERS

Students wishing to enroll in Dickinson ISD schools must provide:

- Birth Certificate (in primary grades)
- Social Security Number
- Proof of Residency (utility bill or lease agreement)
- Record of up-to-date immunizations
- Previous Report Card for all students entering grades 2 through 12

For kindergarten, students must be 5 years old on or before September 1 of the current school year; for first grade, students must be 6 years old on or before September 1 of the current school year. DISD allows students on an out-of-district non-tuition basis.

# FINANCES AND TAX RATE

Total tax rate for Dickinson ISD homeowners is **\$1.738 per \$100** valuation. The total DISD M &O budget for 2004-2005 is \$41,648,727. Budget expenditures by category, less bond fund payments, are as follows:
