House Bill 5 makes major changes to EOC exams and graduation requirements starting with 2014-2015 freshman

The 83rd Regular Session of the Texas Legislature passed HB 5 and it became effective with the Governor's signature in June 2013. This bill made changes to the Texas Education Code (TEC) in a number of areas including curriculum, accountability, assessment and accreditation. Major changes were made to the high school graduation requirements for students who will be freshmen during the 2014-2015 school year. HB 5 is designed to instill more flexibility in public education enabling students to either pursue a traditional path into colleges and universities or move directly into the workforce to help fill what business leaders say is a critical skills shortage.

Texas students must now pass five end-of-course exams instead of 15 to meet state graduation requirements. The five EOC's are: English I, English II, Algebra I, U.S. History and Biology. HB 5 eliminated the requirement that districts include the EOC results as 15 percent of course grades. The Foundation High School Program replaces the state's 4x4 graduation plan and allows students to receive endorsements in specific areas. The information is designed to provide assistance in understanding the changes and graduation plans that will impact our students over the next few years.

Dickinson High School counselors will schedule individualized meetings with all 2014-2015 freshmen and their families between October 2014-March 2015 to finalize endorsements and four-year plans.

Dickinson ISD launches text messaging feature to communicate time-sensitive information with parents

Dickinson ISD will have a new method to communicate with parents the next time the district has time sensitive information to share about an emergency or school closure situation.

The school district is launching a new service that will enhance communication by allowing the district to deliver important information to parents via the School Messenger text messaging service. This service is not intended to replace the district's existing means of communication, but rather it will enhance them in the event of an emergency.

In order to participate in the new service, parents must indicate their willingness to receive text messages to their phone. The process is simple and takes only a few seconds to complete.

Simply text any one of the following words to the number 68453: subscribe, optin, yes. The message, "You are registered to receive approx 3 msgs/mo. Txt STOP to quit, HELP for help" will be received letting you know the registration process was successful.

The opt-in process can be repeated for any other wireless numbers you want to include. While there is no charge from the district for this service, parents are asked to remember when signing up for the text messaging service that they are resposible for any text messaging charges from their wireless provide for receiving text messages.

In addition to performing the opt-in process above, parents are asked to ensure the district has correct wireless numbers updated in the Skyward student database.

Dickinson ISD is offering Online Registration for Returning Students for the 2014-2015 School Year

Please read over the information below carefully to understand how the online registration process will work for returning Dickinson ISD students.

From August 4-15, 2014, Dickinson ISD parents will be able to take advantage of the district's online registration process for returning students. These are students who attend a Dickinson ISD campus at the end of the 2013-2014 and will be returning for the 2014-2015 school year.

A copy of proof of residency is still required to be dropped off at the campus; however, this can be done during a two-week period in August, without having to stand in long lines normally associated with registration each year.

The online registration process will be available through the school district website at www.dickinsonisd.org. The district will have complete instructions on the website this summer to walk parents through the steps they need to take.

In order to complete the online registration process, parents must have their login information (user name and password) for Skyward Family Access. **If a parent does not have login information, this can be obtained by showing proper identification in the front office at their child's school.** Please make sure you have obtained login information ahead of time so you are not delayed in registering your student online. For parents without access to the Internet, computers and assistance will be available at the campuses during designated times to complete the online registration process.

Parents of students new to Dickinson ISD for 2014-2015 must visit the campus their child will attend and complete the registration process in person as there is more paperwork involved for new students. Returning students to Dickinson ISD may complete the online registration process:

Online registration will be available August 4-15, 2014 for families of returning Dickinson ISD students through the Skyward Family Access Site. A copy of proof of residency is still required. Please drop off a copy of proof of residency at the front office to your child's elementary school between the hours of 8 a.m. - 4 p.m. Monday-Friday, August 4-15, 2014. Please put the name(s) of your student(s) and their grade level for 2014-2015 on the proof of residency so we can validate your residential status for all students active at our campus. Proof of Residency includes a current gas, water, electricity bill or lease in the parent's name; If the bill/lease is NOT in parent/guardian's name, additional forms will be required including the service of a notary to complete the registration process in order to validate enrollment.

Assistance for individuals who request help with online registration will be offered at campuses during New Student Registration from 1 p.m. - 7 p.m. August 6 and 8 a.m. - 12 p.m. August 7.

When coming to register your new DISD student(s), parents/guardians must bring COPIES of the following documents for each child Pre-Kindergarten through 4th grade:

- Student's Birth Certificate, Immunization Record, Social Security Card, Medication information
- Valid parent ID, (Driver's License, passport, military ID);
- Court paperwork for Guardianship(s);
- Proof of Residency (current gas, water, electricity bill or lease in parent's name; If the bill/lease is NOT in parent/guardian's name, additional forms will be required including the service of a notary to complete the registration process in order to validate enrollment;
- Copy of Divorce/Custody documents, if applicable;
- Special Education/Section 504 information, if applicable;
- · Copy of last report card if transferring from another District.

Kindergarten students must be 5 years old on or before September 1. Pre-Kindergarten students must be 4 years old on or before September 1 and meet one or more of the following criteria:

- Student is unable to speak or comprehend the English language;
- Student is economically disadvantaged with proof parental/family income & benefits;
- Student is homeless;
- Student is child of active duty member of the US Armed Forces
- Student is the child of a member of the US Armed Forces that was killed or injured while on active duty;
- Student is or ever was in the conservatorship of the Department of Family and Protective Services following an adversary hearing.

Enrollment paperwork must be completed before meeting with counselors, at which time they will evaluate transcripts and assist students with course selections for the 2014-2015 school year. Registration will continue after school begins.

Current Student Registration:

For 2014-15, Dickinson ISD will be using an online process for current student registration. This process must be complete prior to picking up your schedule.

August 4 - August 15, 2014

Online Registration for all current DISD students will be open. Parents must have access to Skyward in order to do the registration process. The students' Skyward access does not have the capabilities to do the online registration. Instructions for completing the online registration are available on the Dickinson ISD website.

August 7 - August 8, 2014

DHS will have a computer lab open from 7:30-11 a.m. and 12-3 p.m. to assist families with completing the online registration process.

First Day Schedule Pick-up, August 25, 2014

All Dickinson High School students will report to their Homeroom class on the first day of school, August 25, 2014. Student names will be posted in various locations around the building indicating the student's assigned Homeroom teacher and room number. During Homeroom, student schedules will be distributed. There will be no early schedule pick-up this year.

Parking Permits

Parking permits are required for all student vehicles. Students will be assigned a parking space in a designated school parking lot. In order to purchase a parking permit, students must present a valid Texas Driver's License and proof of insurance for the vehicle. Parking spaces are limited and will be sold on a space-available basis. Parking permits must be permanently affixed to the inside of the front windshield on the lower right-hand (passenger) side of the windshield. Parking permits are NOT TRANSFERRABLE to a vehicle other than the one for which the permit was purchased. Any vehicle parked in the school parking lot without a valid parking permit is subject to removal at the owner's expense. Parking permits are \$30 each and will be available for purchase according to the following schedule:

GATOR 9 Camp: August 15, 2014; Noon to 3:00 PM

We invite all Freshman students to attend our Dickinson High School GATOR 9 Camp. This is a three hour orientation during which time students will get their 2014-2015 schedules, meet their teachers, participate in a tour of the building, and attend a Pep Rally. DISD bus transportation from/back-to the DISD elementary school campus closest to the student's home will be provided. PROHIBITED ITEMS

cargo/safari pants or other pants with oversize pockets athletic pants (jogging/windsuit/sweat) overalls/coveralls sagging pants garments with holes worn or torn in them

pants/jeans/capris: acceptable

appropriately sized, fitting at the waist cuffed/hemmed at or below ankle embroidery on standard back pockets capris clearly mid-calf length

<u>skirts, dresses, jumpers</u>

OUTSIDE JACKETS AND COATS

All fabrics are acceptable. May be DISD school letter jackets. 3/4 length (or less) jackets/coats are acceptable.

not acceptable:

Full length jackets/coats such as those commonly referred to as "trench" coats or "dusters".

SHOES

Students must wear shoes safe and appropriate for school.

not acceptable:

house slippers, flip flops or shoes with skates/wheels

HAIR

Hair must be neat, clean and well groomed. Mustaches and beards are prohibited, and faces must be cleanshaven.

> *not acceptable: distracting/extreme styles and/or coloring*

MISCELLANEOUS

New students enrolling in Dickinson ISD will be provided a grace period up to fifteen (15) calendar days to comply with the dress code. No shorts allowed during the grace period.

High School ROTC uniforms are considered standardized dress on designated days.

Tattoos (temporary and permanent) must be covered at all times (at school or while representing the school) Earrings may be worn in the ear only. Shirts must be appropriately buttoned.

PROHIBITED ITEMS

Revealing or excessively tight garments. Spandex/tights may not be worn as pants/shirt. Garments with holes worn or torn in them. Glitter, writing/drawing on the face or skin. Sunglasses.

Any type of head covering (no cap, hat, hair net, hair rollers or combs may be worn inside the building).

Any body piercing except on the ear, such as nose rings, lip rings, tongue rings.

Heavy chains, heavy chain necklaces, spike necklaces, or other inappropriate types of jewelry.

Accessories with inappropriate decorations or advertisements including but not limited to violence, drugs, alcohol, the occult, gang membership, sex, death, or suicide.

Due to safety issues, student backpacks at all campuses must be clear or mesh.

2014-2015 Texas Minimum State Vaccine Requirements for Students Grades K-12



This chart summarizes the vaccine requirements incorporated in the Texas Administrative Code (TAC), Title 25 Health Services, Sections 97.61 to 97.72. This chart is not intended as a substitute for consulting the TAC, which has other provisions and details. <u>Click here for complete TAC language</u>.

The Department of State Health Services (DSHS) is granted authority to set immunization requirements by the Texas Education Code, Chapter 38, Health & Safety, Subchapter A, General Provisions.

² Serologic confirmation of immunity to measles, mumps, rubella, hepatitis B, hepatitis A, or varicella or serologic evidence of infection is acceptable in place of vaccine.

³ Previous illness may be documented with a written statement from a physician, school nurse, or the child's parent or guardian containing wording such as: "This is to verify that (name of student) had varicella disease (chickenpox) on or about (date) and does not need varicella vaccine." This written statement will be acceptable in place of any and all varicella vaccine doses required.

Exemptions

The law allows (a) physicians to write a statement stating that the vaccine(s) required would be medically harmful or injurious to the health and well-being of the child or household member, and (b) parents/guardians to choose an exemption from immunization requirements for reasons of conscience, including a religious belief. The law does not allow parents/guardians to elect an exemption simply because of inconvenience (for example, a record is lost or incomplete and it is too much trouble to go to a physician or clinic to correct the problem). Schools and child-care facilities should maintain an up-to-date list of students with exemptions, so they may be excluded in times of emergency or epidemic declared by the commissioner of public health.

Instructions for requesting the official exemption affidavit that must be signed by parents/guardians choosing the exemption for reasons of conscience, including a religious belief, can be found at <u>www.ImmunizeTexas.com</u>. Original Exemption Affidavit must be completed and submitted to the school or child-care facility.

For children claiming medical exemptions, a written statement by the physician must be submitted to the school or child-care facility.

Provisional Enrollment

All immunizations should be completed by the first date of attendance. The law requires that students be fully vaccinated against the specified diseases. A student may be enrolled provisionally if the student has an immunization record that indicates the student has received at least one dose of each specified age-appropriate vaccine required by this rule. To remain enrolled, the student must complete the required subsequent doses in each vaccine series on schedule and as rapidly as is medically feasible and provide acceptable evidence of vaccination to the school. A school nurse or school administrator shall review the immunization status of a provisionally enrolled student every 30 days to ensure continued compliance in completing the required doses of vaccination. If, at the end of the 30-day period, a student has not received a subsequent dose of vaccine, the student is not in compliance and the school shall exclude the student from school attendance until the required dose is administered.

Documentation

Since many types of personal immunization records are in use, any document will be acceptable provided a physician or public health personnel has validated it. The month, day, and year that the vaccination was received must be recorded on all school immunization records created or updated after September 1, 1991.

District Meal Charge Policy:

<u>Student Verbal Reminder Daily</u>: When balance drops below \$6.00 Paid or \$2.00 Reduced. Daily reminder from cashier to student that they need money. When account balance is negative an <u>automated call and an email</u> will occur and continue daily until the account is brought to a positive balance. Parent may use <u>Lunch Money Now</u> online or bring cash or check to cashier before 2 p.m.

If FNS has not received payment and the charge amounts to \$15.00 then FNS will send a U.S. Postal **letter to the parent** to remind them we have been feeding the child in good faith, and that money is owed to the student's account. <u>Automated calls will continue</u>. If after being notified by mail and FNS has not received payment and the charge is \$20.00 or more FNS managers will contact their school office to make contact with the parent.

Dickinson ISD will collect on all unpaid meal charges. The parent/guardian is responsible to repay any charges that have accrued before the end of the school year and for charges made prior to application approval.

• In-Sufficient Checks: Checks returned for insufficient funds <u>will not be</u> accepted for future payments and will be charged a fee and assessed to the <u>student account</u>. Cash, money orders or using Lunch Money Now will be the only forms of payment.
