Dickinson ISD Distributes \$100 Tanger Outlet Gift Cards

Dickinson Education Foundation and Indorama Ventures LLC. supplement donations from Tanger Outlets



Generous monetary donations were given to Dickinson ISD that were used to provide \$100 gift cards to Tanger Outlet Mall to help students and employees displaced by the hurricane replace some of the clothing and items that may have been lost in the flooding.

Tanger Outlet Mall donated \$75,000, Indorama Ventures LLC. donated \$20,000 and the Dickinson Education Foundation contributed the \$37,000 in donations given via their Facebook Fundraising Campaign. These contributions allow for 1,320 students and employees to receive a Tanger Outlet Mall gift card.

Summary of Education Foundation Relief Efforts

- Kohl's-78 associates volunteered to stuff donation care kits and backpacks donated by the Houston Texans. The care kits were hygiene products, baby products as well as socks and underwear. These volunteer hours will be a monetary donation of approximately \$17,000.00 to the Education Foundation.
- Houston Texans donated 25-\$25 gift cards totaling \$5,000 that we divided up and sent to principals at each campus they also donated \$3000 worth of backpacks.
- The DISDEF started a facebook campaign for Harvey Relief: \$35,494.00-was raised across the United States from various generous donors- These funds were used along with Tanger Outlet Mall that donated \$75,000 and Indorama Ventures LLC \$20,000 to purchase \$100 giftcards for 1,320 students and employees of DISD.
- Galveston Rotary donated \$700 (gift cards/cash). (These were divided and sent to campus principals to help support immediate needs of families effected the worst by Harvey.)
- School supply list posted on Facebook was fulfilled. (Supply room is now set up at the ESC where teachers can come and get supplies that were donated.)
- Organized effort to get immediate needs met of our teachers. Volunteers took water and bleach to our employees. Just days after the storm, we used the ESC as a hub.
- Utilized Facebook for Gator Academy needs: 9 cribs, 3 changing stations, swings, nap mats (all brand new) were donated.
- Target donated \$3,000 to purchase baby furniture for Gator Academy. (Jeff Pack Director of Elementary programs and two other volunteers purchased supplies.)
- Created Harvey link with information about donations and needs with help from Jenna Simsen.
- Numerous donors sending trucks with supplies from all over Texas and other states (New York, New Jersey, Wisconsin).
- Wylie ISD sent backpacks and \$1,500 (Michael Eames).
- Donation from Austin with specials needs supplies, CPAP machine, GI feeding kit and wheelchairs for special programs.
- 77,000 articles of new clothing donated by Fanatics Clothing. Currently being distributed at the ESC.
- Drive for "We are Dickinson" shirts and 10% of the profits will be returned to the Foundation. This drive was started by Clay Menotti.
- Massage Heights donated free massages to volunteers.
- Colleen O'Brien helped to get over 4,000 pairs of shoes donated. We set up times for counselors to come get shoes and clothing for the children in need.
- M.I. Lewis Social Services Center and United Way Galveston County Mainland donated \$25,000 to the Dickinson Education Foundation
