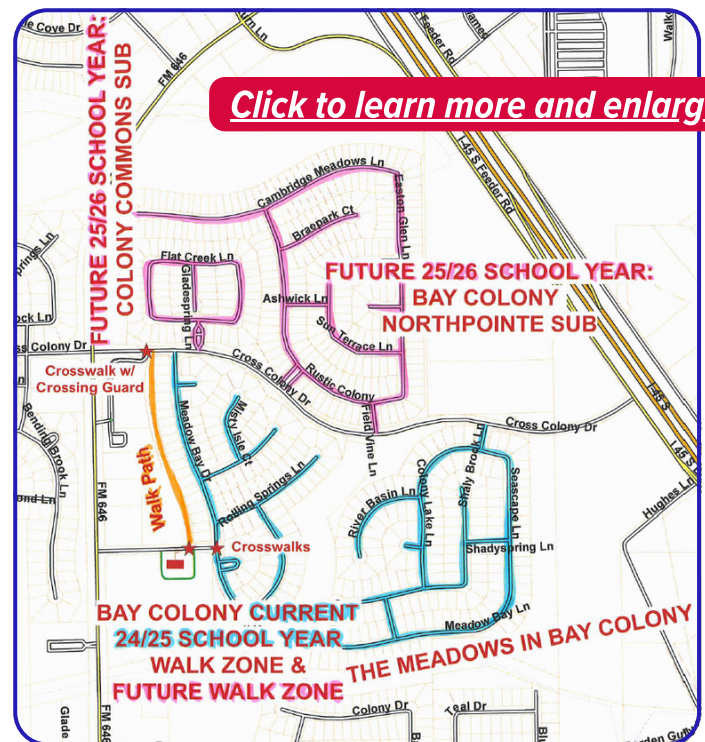

UPDATED WALK ZONES FOR BAY COLONY ELEMENTARY

Updated Walk Zones Coming for 2025–2026

DISD has updated its walk zone boundaries for the 2025–2026 school year. These updates now include a newly designated walk zone for students attending Bay Colony Elementary.

Families are encouraged to review the updated zone information prior to the start of the school year to prepare for any changes in transportation eligibility.



Bay Colony Elementary Walk Zone Expansion

Beginning in the 2025–2026 school year, the walk zone for Bay Colony Elementary will expand to include several nearby subdivisions:

- The Meadows in Bay Colony (located directly behind the campus, south of Cross Colony Drive)
- Colony Commons and Bay Colony Northpointe (located north of Cross Colony Drive)

To support this change, a crosswalk and crossing guard at Cross Colony Drive and the walk path between business center and Meadow Bay Dr will be put in place. Also, a crosswalk will be put in place where the walk path meets Bay Colony Elementary Drive.

Limited Open Enrollment for Students in Grades Pre-k through 12th Grade

Eligibility: The program is open to non-resident students in Pre-k through 12th grade. Limited enrollment is based on classroom space and teacher availability, previous year attendance, behavior, and academic performance.

Transportation: Transportation is not provided.

Application Process: Please complete the Limited Open Enrollment Application. Application must be completed by a parent or guardian of student wishing to transfer into Dickinson ISD.

Yearly Review: Students must apply every year. Grades, discipline, and attendance will be reviewed each year.

Centralized New Student Enrollment – July 31 or August 1

Dickinson ISD is excited to welcome new families for the 2025–2026 school year! To make enrollment easier, the district will host a Centralized New Student Enrollment event at Dickinson High School (3800 Baker Drive) on:

- Thursday, July 31 | 11 a.m. - 6 p.m. **OR** Friday, August 1 | 8 a.m. – 3 p.m.

This event allows families to complete enrollment for all new students—regardless of campus—in one convenient location. Families only need to attend one of the dates.

What to Do:

1. Start Online – Opens Tuesday, July 22
2. Visit www.dickinsonisd.org/newenrollment starting Tuesday, July 22 to begin the online enrollment process in Skyward. This step is required before attending the event.
3. Gather Required Documents: [View required documents](#) [Click here](#)
4. Bring important documents like proof of residency, birth certificate, immunization records, and parent ID.
5. Attend the Enrollment Event on Thursday, July 31 **or** Friday, August 1.
6. At the event, staff will guide parents through the final steps, including document verification, campus registration, transportation, food services, and more. High school students will also take ID photos and meet with counselors about course schedules.

Can't Attend?

Parents who can't make it to any one of the centralized event must contact their child's campus directly to complete enrollment.

Pre-Kindergarten Students (Click for more Information)

To qualify for the Pre-Kindergarten program, a student must reside in Dickinson ISD, be four years old on or before September 1, 2025, and meet at least one or more of the pre-kindergarten criteria. What to Expect at the In-Person Centralized Enrollment Event:

Parents of students new to Dickinson ISD are invited to complete enrollment at our Centralized Enrollment Event. Families can choose to attend either date, July 31 or August 1. This is your one-stop shop to finish registration, turn in documents, meet campus staff, and get ready for the school year!

Upon arrival, families will check in and receive a station checklist. You'll visit each station to complete the process:

Computer Lab – Need help with online enrollment? Staff will be available to assist.

Documentation Check – Staff will review paperwork and verify addresses for school assignments.

Notary Services – Available for families needing residency affidavits.

Nurse Station – Immunization records reviewed. Vaccines may be available onsite.

Campus Tables – Meet school staff, ask questions, upload documents, and get Skyward login info.

Food & Nutrition Services – Get help with Free/Reduced Meal Applications.

Transportation Info – Learn about bus routes and eligibility.

Special Programs – Talk with staff about available student support services.

Student ID Photos – High school students will take their ID pictures.

Counselors (Grades 6–12) – Schedule classes and review academic needs.

Required Documents for Centralized Enrollment

There are several documents needed to complete enrollment for a new Dickinson ISD student. Make sure to gather together all the following documents for each new student. If possible, parents are requested to bring copies of all documents to leave with the campus and make the process run more quickly.

- Student's Birth Certificate and Immunization Record
- Proof of Residency - current utility bill (electric, gas, or water) or lease/mortgage/tax statement in parent's name
- Valid parent ID (Driver License, passport, or military ID)
- Student's Medication information, if applicable
- Student's Social Security Card (OPTIONAL, but needed if SSN was used at a previous district.)
- Court paperwork for Guardianship(s), if applicable
- Complete copy of Divorce/Custody documents (all pages), if applicable
- Special Education/Section 504 information, if applicable
- Copy of last report card if the student is transferring from another District, as well as the name, address and phone number of the last school attended
- High School students are asked to bring a copy of their unofficial transcript and/or a copy of their last report card to assist with the selection of courses

Kindergarten Students

To be eligible for Kindergarten, a student must reside In Dickinson ISD and be five years old on or before September 1, 2025.

PRE-KINDERGARTEN ELIGIBILITY

Pre-Kindergarten Students

To qualify for the Pre-Kindergarten program, a student must reside in Dickinson ISD, be four years old on or before September 1, 2025, and meet at least one or more of the pre-kindergarten criteria. All Dickinson ISD pre-kindergarten students attend a full-day of classes with the same hours as other elementary students of 8:30 a.m.- 4 p.m. Please review the documents needed to enroll a student:

All Qualifiers (Required for All Students):

- Birth Certificate
- Proof of Address
- Parent ID
- Immunization Record

Military Qualifiers (One of the Following):

- Verification of U.S. Department of Defense photo ID
- Statement of service
- Copy of death certificate
- Copy of Purple Heart orders
- Copy of official letter from commander
- Copy of a letter from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs
- Documentation that service member is MIA

Income Qualifiers (One of the Following):

- Current paycheck stub
- Current tax return (if self-employed)
- Current TANF or SNAP eligibility letter
- Language Qualifiers:
 - Complete the Home Language Survey (provided by the school)
 - Child will take a language test

Foster Care Qualifiers:

- Verification Letter of Prekindergarten Eligibility from DFPS

Star of Texas Award Qualifiers:

- Copy of the resolution (certificate) awarded to parent of the child

Skyward Family Access

DISD uses Skyward Family Access as the district's secure online portal for families. Through Skyward, parents and guardians can complete registration and enrollment, view and update student information, access grades and attendance records, and stay informed about their child's academic progress throughout the school year.

Returning Student Registration: July 22-August 6, 2025

All Dickinson ISD families must complete online registration for returning students between July 22 and August 6, 2025. This applies to students who attended a DISD campus during the 2024-2025 school year and are returning for 2025-2026.

To receive bus service the first week of school, registration and proof of residency must be completed by August 6.

Skyward Login Required:

To register, you'll need your Skyward Family Access username and password. If you do not have this, visit your child's campus front office with a photo ID to obtain login credentials.

DICKINSON ISD MINIMUM IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

Pre-Kindergarten / Kindergarten Enrollment

- DTaP – 4 doses*
- Polio – 3 doses*
- MMR – 2doses**
- Hepatitis B - 3 doses
- Varicella – 2 doses**
- Hepatitis A – 2 doses**

*One dose must be received on/after fourth birthday.

**First dose must be received on/after first birthday.

Pre-Kindergarten Additional Requirements

- Pneumococcal conjugate Vaccine (PCV)- 4 doses+
- Haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib) – 3 doses++
- At least three doses, with one dose administered on or after 12 months of age, or two doses administered on or after 12 months of age, or one dose administered on or after 24 months of age. Otherwise, one additional dose is required. ++A complete Hib series consists of two doses, followed by a booster dose on or after 12 months of age, for a total of three doses. If a child receives the first dose of Hib vaccine at 12 - 14 months of age, only one additional dose is required (two doses total). Any child who has received a single dose of Hib vaccine on or after 15 - 59 months of age complies with these specified vaccine requirements.

7th Grade Immunization Requirements

In addition to all of the above, the following are required for entry into the 7th grade:

Tdap/Td- 1 booster within the last 5 years

MCV4- 1 dose is required on/after the student's 11th birthday

Exemptions

Medical: The law allows medical exemptions if the immunization required would be injurious to the child's health for medical reasons. The medical exemption must clearly state the medical reason the child cannot receive specific vaccines and signed by a US-licensed MD or DO. The written statement by the physician must be submitted to the school nurse. Unless it is written in the statement that a lifelong condition exists, the exemption statement is valid for only one year from the date signed by the physician.

For reasons of conscience, including religious beliefs: The law allows parents/guardians to choose an exemption from immunization requirements for reasons of conscience, including a religious belief. The completed and returned form from the Texas DSHS must be submitted to the school nurse in order for the student to be admitted. The school will accept only the original official affidavit forms developed and issued by the Texas DSHS. The affidavit will be valid for two years.

The Dickinson ISD Dress Code is established to teach grooming, hygiene, instill discipline and modesty, prevent disruption, avoid safety hazards, teach respect for authority, and prepare our students for the future.

The student's appearance (clothing, shoes, accessories and grooming) *shall not reflect gang affiliation, cause a distraction, nor conceal contraband.* **ADMINISTRATORS HAVE THE RESPONSIBILITY AND RIGHT TO DETERMINE APPROPRIATENESS OF ATTIRE AND GROOMING FOR THE SCHOOL SETTING.**

GRADES PK-5

PANTS, SLACKS, JEANS, SKIRTS, DRESSES, JUMPERS, SHORTS, SHIRTS, BLOUSES OR PULLOVERS:

- May be any color or design
- Shall be appropriately sized, fitting at the waist, and cuffed/hemmed at or below mid-calf.
- Jeans/pants with tears/holes above the knee must be worn with tights underneath
- Shorts may be no shorter than mid-thigh in length with a hem. No cut off shorts.
- The length/slits of skirts, dresses, and jumpers must be clearly below mid-thigh.
- Leggings or yoga pants may be worn with acceptable clothing over them. Coverage should extend to top of the thigh in the front and below the posterior end.
- Shirts, blouses, or pullovers must have sleeves and must be appropriately sized and buttoned.
- Shirts, blouses, or pullovers may not be sheer, lace, or any see-through material (even if worn with an undergarment/camisole/slip), backless, cut-out, off-the-shoulder, spaghetti strap, sundress, tank-style, sleeveless, low-cut, back exposed, or revealing in any way
- No vinyl, leather, suede, fleece, spandex/stretch, oversized pockets, pajamas, overalls, sweatpants, or coveralls.
- No inappropriate pictures or messages allowed.
- Underclothes may not be worn as outer clothes, including men's T shirts.

OUTSIDE JACKETS AND COATS

- All jackets/coats that are $\frac{3}{4}$ lengths (or less) are acceptable.
- "Trench" coats or "Dusters" are not allowed.
- No inappropriate pictures, messages, or buttons allowed.

SHOES

- Shoes must be safe and appropriate for school.
- No house slippers, slides, flip flops, or shoes with skates, wheels or cleats.
- Campuses with stairs may require shoes with backs for safety reasons.

HAIR

- Hair (including facial hair) must be neat, clean, and well-groomed.
- No distracting/extreme styles or coloring.

BACKPACKS

GRADES 6-12

PANTS, SLACKS, JEANS, SKIRTS, DRESSES, JUMPERS, SHORTS, SHIRTS, BLOUSES OR PULLOVERS:

- May be any color or design
- Shall be appropriately sized, fitting at the waist, and cuffed/hemmed at or below mid-calf.
- Jeans/pants with tears/holes above the knee must be worn with tights underneath.
- Shorts may be no shorter than mid-thigh in length with a hem. No cut off shorts.
- The lengths/slits of skirts, shorts, dresses and jumpers must be no more than 4" above the top of the knee when standing upright.
- Leggings or yoga pants may be worn with acceptable clothing over them. Coverage should extend to top of the thigh in the front and below the posterior end.
- Leggings and/or jeggings must be appropriately sized and made from fabric that adequately conceals the body and the undergarment(s).
- Shirts, blouses, or pullovers must have sleeves. Must be appropriately sized and buttoned.
- Shirts, blouses, or pullovers may NOT be: sheer, lace, any see-through material (even if worn with an undergarment/camisole/slip), backless, cut-out, off-the-shoulder, spaghetti strap, tank-style, sleeveless, low-cut, or midriff.
- Shirts, blouses, or pullover must not be revealing in any way. Shoulders, the back, and the midriff must be covered.
- No vinyl, leather, suede, fleece,
- Pajamas or any form of clothing designed for lounging or sleep may not be worn.
- Under garments may not be worn as outer clothes including men's T shirts.

OUTSIDE JACKETS AND COATS

- All jackets/coats that are $\frac{3}{4}$ lengths (or less) are acceptable.
- "Trench" coats or "Dusters" are not allowed.
- No inappropriate pictures or messages allowed.

SHOES

- Shoes must be safe and appropriate for school.
- No house slippers, slides, flip flops, or shoes with skates, wheels or cleats.
- Campuses with stairs may require shoes with backs for safety reasons.

HAIR

- Hair (including facial hair) must be neat, clean, and well-groomed.

- Inappropriate decorations or advertisements including, but not limited to, violence, drugs, alcohol, the occult, gang membership, sex, death, suicide, etc.
- Bandanas worn or displayed in any manner (all colors).
- Any attire or icons that are distracting, that causes a disturbance or interferes with daily school activities, or identifies a student as part of an unauthorized group, gang, or society are not permitted.
