SUICIDE PREVENTION PROCEDURES

The purpose of this procedure is to provide guidance that will enable district staff to protect the health and well-being of all students by having procedures in place to prevent, screen for risk, refer and respond to suicide and suicide ideation.

DISD STAFF WILL COMPLETE ESTABLISHED PROCEDURES WHEN:

Student shows signs of being at risk for suicide or says something that indicates suicidal ideation or self-harm.

Threat to Others

SCHOOL BEHAVIORAL THREAT ASSESSMENT

The purpose of this procedure is to have a systematic process that is designed to

- Identify persons of concern
- Gather information/investigate
- Assess person and situation
- Manage the person/situation

DISD STAFF WILL COMPLETE ESTABLISHED PROCEDURES WHEN:

Student shows harmful, threatening or violent behavior. A threat is a concerning communication or behavior that indicates that an individual poses a danger to the safety of school staff or students through acts of violence or other behavior that would cause harm to others. The threat may be communicated behaviorally, orally, visually, in writing, electronically, or through any other means, and is considered a threat regardless of whether it is observed by or communicated directly to the target of the threat or observed by or communicated to a third party, and regardless of whether the target of the threat is aware of the threat.
