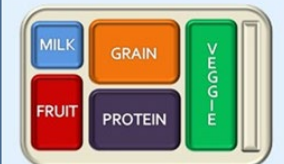

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

National School Lunch and Breakfast Programs

Dickinson ISD Food & Nutrition Services is committed to providing our students with healthy school meals. Menus are designed to provide a variety of food choices to meet the USDA standards to ensure that children have the energy they need to learn and be physically active, while reducing their risk for obesity and serious chronic diseases.

Charge Policy

The district will allow all paid, grade-level students (PK-12) to charge two lunch meals, equal to \$5.00/\$5.50/\$6.00 depending on the campus your student attends. When the meal charge limit is reached, students in all grade levels (PK-12) will be offered a courtesy meal. A la carte items and additional entrée purchases may not be charged. Notifications to Parent or Guardian of meal account balances: The district will send reminders weekly when a student's account balance is negative. An automated email will be sent daily when a student's account is negative. Administration Assistance: Student accounts that remain negative for one month will be forwarded to the campus administration. Grace Period and allowable meal charges depleted: The parent/guardian is expected to pay charges promptly.

Student accounts

All students have a personal meal account where money may be manually deposited using the new cloud-based system, "PaySchools Central". We encourage all parents and/or guardians to register at PaySchoolsCentral.com or through their mobile app. Please note, PaySchools Central is for meal payments only. We encourage either auto-pay or monthly deposits to help speed up the serving lines at mealtime and to prevent charging. Standard processing fees apply to online payments. For more information regarding making deposits onto your student's account, please refer to the FNS website or contact our FNS office. Parents may get information about their student's eating habits anytime by utilizing PaySchools Central's detailed meal activity reports, contacting the cafeteria manager via email or phone, or the Food and Nutrition Services (FNS) Office. Payments can still be made with cash or check at any campus. Checks are made payable to DISD Child Nutrition Services. Please put your child's first and last name and student ID# on all checks. Parents may request that a message be placed on their child's account to prevent the student(s) from purchasing extra items. Please contact the FNS Office for more information: 281-229-6012

Free/Reduced Meal Applications

Free and reduced meal applications are available. Online applications are preferred for accuracy and are available along with instructions by clicking the Meal App Now link at www.dickinsonisd.org; paper applications are available by request. All families must submit a new application for free or reduced meals each school year. Prior year meal benefit status will change when the 2025-26 application is processed. If a family does not apply for 2025-26 meal benefits within the first 30 operating days, meal benefits will be terminated. If a new application has not been approved, the student will be required to pay full price for meals and will be responsible for all charges. Free and reduced income guidelines are established by the USDA.
