Pat Spies approved as Principal at Kranz Junior High

Kranz Junior High Assistant Principal Pat Spies was approved by the Board of Trustees in a 5-0 vote to be the next principal at Kranz Junior High. Spies began his educational career as a teacher and coach at the middle schools and high school. He spent over a decade at Dickinson High School, where he taught English and coached football and basketball. In 2019, Spies transitioned to the assistant principal role at Kranz Junior High, where he has been instrumental in leading instructional systems and managing student discipline to promote academic growth and a positive campus culture. His extensive experience in teaching, coaching, and leadership, along with his dedication to student and staff success, makes him the ideal candidate to serve as a next principal at Kranz.

Kim Kelley appointed as new Director of School Leadership

Kranz Junior High Principal Kim Kelley has been approved for a new role in Dickinson ISD at the district level. In Other Action...

- The Board approved the guaranteed maximum price for package #1 to begin construction of Elementary #8 in Lago Mar. The total of \$5,519,521 was approved to cover some of the concrete work, dirt work, underground work, and storm drainage. A groundbreaking ceremony is scheduled for 9 a.m. Monday, September 30 to celebrate the start of construction. The campus is tentatively scheduled for open in August 2026 to serve students in grades Pre-K-5th grade.
- The Board also approved opting out of Transportation Code 547.701 related to seat belts of school buses due to budget limitations. a policy update related to student travel, certified district appraisers, the Human Resources Department recruiting calendar, and consent agenda items.
- The Board approved two resignations.
- The Board received written reports and a summary of the 2024-2025 Dickinson ISD District Improvement Plan and each Campus Improvement Plan.

Teacher Incentive Allotment Recipients

Dickinson ISD had 35 teacher qualify to receive the Teacher Incentive Allotment during the August 2024 distribution. The TIA was created in 2019 as part of House Bill 3, and the goal of the program is to recruit, retain, and reward high-quality teachers by providing a state stipend based on performance.

To receive a designation, a teacher must be National Board Certified or identified as a top-performing teacher per the standards provided by TEA as well as meet district criteria. The three designation levels are Recognized, Exemplary, and Master, and the stipend amount varies from \$903 - \$20,060 based on the designation level and current campus assignment.

The data the district submitted from the 2022-2023 school year for validation, reliability, and review passed critical data tests performed by Texas Tech University and the Texas Education Agency, and this means 35 DISD teachers were eligible to receive a state stipend last month.
